Dear Mr. Miller:

Your merchant mariner's credential application has been evaluated. Based on the submitted results of your medical examination, the Medical Evaluation Division has determined that special circumstances exist that warrant granting a medical waiver for the following medical condition(s):

- **OBSTRUCTIVE SLEEP APNEA.** Waiver requires submission of an annual sleep specialist evaluation and evidence of compliance through submission of compliance log (for previous twelve months) or maintenance of wakefulness testing (MWT). Waiver requires use of the CPAP device for sleep prior to acting under the authority of the credential. Waiver becomes invalid for noncompliance with CPAP use, or if daytime sleepiness develops.

Waiver(s) become invalid if symptoms develop attributable to the condition which interferes with duties. In the event there is a change in your medical condition, you are to report this to the Coast Guard issuing office within 30 days. The Coast Guard may require that you undertake an immediate medical evaluation to determine whether a medical waiver is still appropriate. Failure to comply with the above may result in administrative action, up to and including suspension or revocation of your credential in accordance with Title 46, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 5.
